The Role & Responsibility of The Parent

The support of the parent(s) is essential to the success of any youth program. This support should be in such activities as fundraising, promotions, equipment maintenance, team sponsorship, game day help, and other volunteer activities.

1. Remember, a positive mental attitude, free from parental pressures, is an important ingredient for the success of any youngster participating in the program.
2. Refrain from open criticisms, especially in the presence of your child(ren), of the program, coaches, or any personnel connected with the organization.
3. Encourage your child(ren) to attend all practice sessions. His/her absence not only impedes his progress but hurts his team as well.
4. Parents/guardians should never be on the practice field nor interrupt a coach during a practice session. Any questions and/or concerns should be addressed with coaching staff before or after practice.
5. Youth cheer is a different dimension than professional cheer or All Star Cheer teams. Cheer hard and loud for your team at the games but remember to keep your fan support in the proper perspective and in good taste.
6. Unsportsmanlike conduct in the stands during games is prohibited. Derogatory statements towards game officials, fans or the opposing team is prohibited and may result in the forfeiture of a game. Alcohol/illicit substances at practices/games are prohibited.
7. Parents are not allowed on the sidelines or playing field. All spectators belong in the stands. Only players, coaches, badged personnel, and officials may be on the sidelines.
8. Parents should clearly understand that the aim of Jr Hornets Football is to teach their athletes teamwork, good sportsmanship, fair play, and a love for the wonderful game of Football.
9. Parents understand that if their athlete is suspended from school, they will be automatically suspended from the Jr Hornets team as well.
10. We cannot be held responsible for the health and welfare of unattended children. Parents are responsible for picking up their child(ren) in a timely manner from practice and/or game sites.
11. The parent realizes the importance of volunteering. The Jr. Hornets is a ALL volunteer organization and can't run without the volunteer support of parents/guardians.

Player's Code of Conduct

Being a member of the team means much more than just learning about and playing football. As a player, both on and off the field, you are a representative of your team, and expected to act accordingly. No matter what the circumstances, whether it be in victory or defeat, always conduct yourself with pride and respect.

1. Good grades are a must! Academics come first, then football. If you are having trouble in school, please tell your coach. If you are doing well in school let your coach know too, so we may celebrate your success!
2. Good citizenship is a must! Any player, who has behavioral issues with law enforcement and/or school officials, or is suspended from school, shall be suspended from the team.
3. You must notify your coach if you are going to miss practice. Attendance at practice is mandatory. Failure to attend practice(s) can result in being benched for game(s), at the coaches discretion for safety or disciplinary reasons.
4. There is no excuse for being late to practice. Plan to be there 15 minutes prior to the start of practice.
5. Vulgarity, temper tantrums, or fighting is absolutely prohibited. Every team member must realize they are representing their team and need to exhibit appropriate behavior.
6. Every team member is required to attend scheduled games(post season included). Failure to attend can result in being benched. You should arrive to each game, as directed, by your coach.
7. Athletes must wear appropriate gear to games, as directed by your coach.
8. Athletes will learn the value of commitment to the team; sportsmanship, ethical conduct, and fair play. They will show courtesy and respect to teammates, opponents, coaches and officials.
9. Athletes are required to immediately inform their coaches of any injury or condition which may affect their participation in a practice session, scrimmage, or game.
10. A player may be benched or not allowed to participate in a game or portions of a game for violation of Player's Code of Conduct.
